

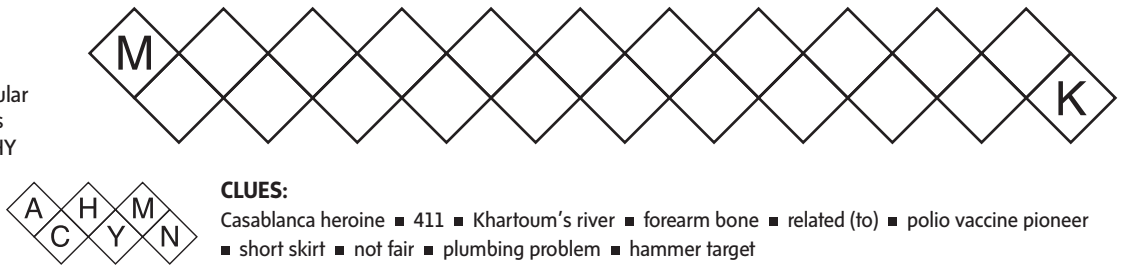

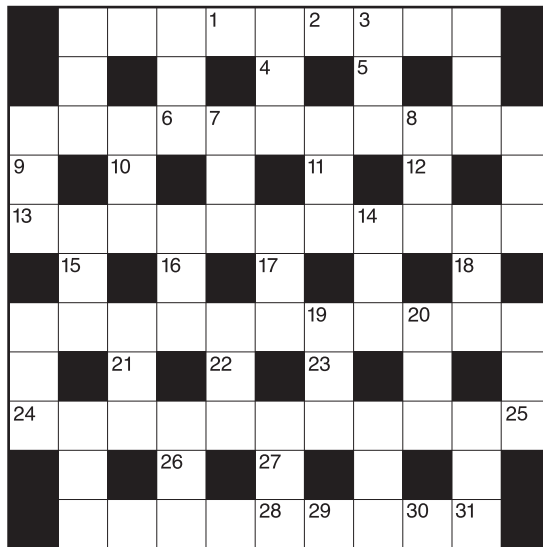
Ribbon

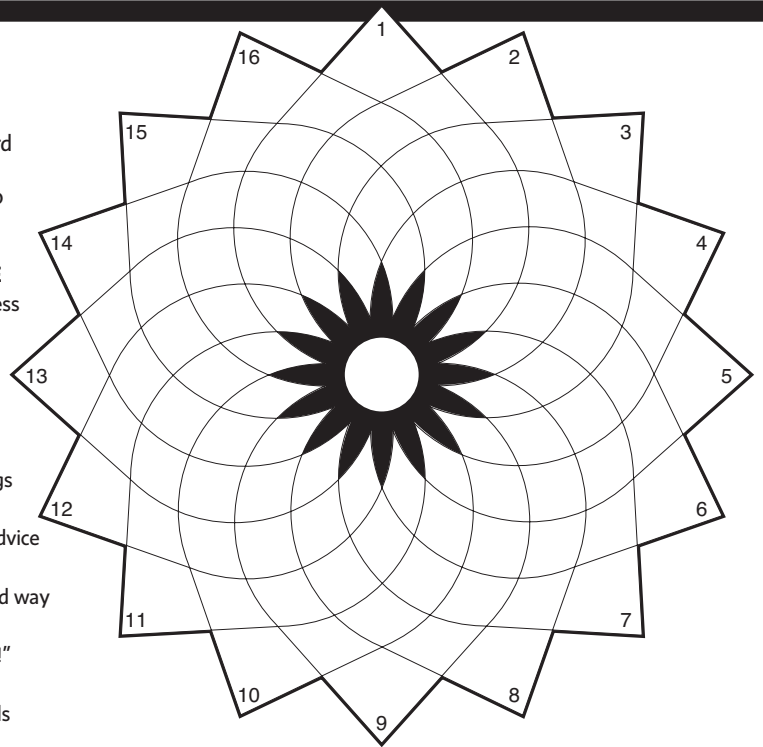

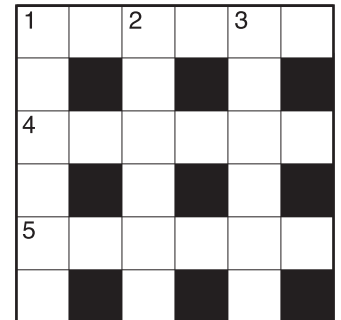

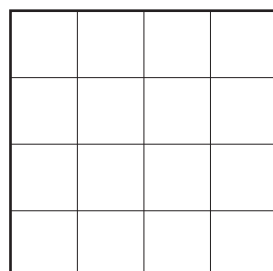
