

A Visit From Colin Hansen

We also learned that once the Prime Minister chooses a speaker, it is tradition that the speaker struggles as he is pulled over to the throne. This is because in the past, many speakers were killed. He also told us a freaky story about a speaker who died before a portrait could be made of him. His dead body had to be propped up in a chair for his portrait to be made. This portrait can be seen in the BC Legislative Buildings in Victoria. Mr. Hansen told us that many years ago the Cabinet and the shadow Cabinet sat two sword lengths apart so that people could not kill each other if there was a dispute. This would no longer happen today of course, but the traditions live on in the Legislative Building. We enjoyed our visit from Mr. Hansen and certainly learned a lot!
