

1. Introduction:

Two successive annual one week "Radio Events" with temporary licences from CRTC were held in the Town of Wabana in 2011, and 2012. In the second year arise that worked to raise money to purchase radio equipment and with the help of interested team members raised \$11,000.00. An application for a CRTC Licence followed. The station is incorporated. The permission of School authorities, and Provincial Department of Education was obtained to build the radio station, CJBI 93.9 FM (RBI) to locate this station at St. Michael's Regional High School (SMRHS). The location was not accidental but was seen as an opportunity to use this community station not only as a vehicle of "social enterprise" but as a "teaching tool" within the school to expand the opportunities of the local Bell Island High school students and provide them with opportunities to participate in the multi dimensional aspects of radio broadcasting. In January 2013, RBI went on the air. The RBI Board was elected. Was was of RBI with as and the capable became the RBI Treasurer.
The first two years of operation go very smoothly and comments include that the is gaining in professional stature with each passing month and building a following as expansion includes efforts to promote the history of Bell Island, the folklore of Bell Island including ghost stories. Not least of those promoting an appreciation of the history of Bell Island and its interesting folklore was the RBI and
The problems seem to begin with the development of a successful (RBI) Radio BINGO. BINGO means money and money is a source of power. The Radio BINGO developed slowly but it became a source of significant money for the three participating players:
The result of the information revealed in the mediation led the Mediator to concerns about a number of issues raised. This mediation was not an investigation into the truth of these allegations. Nor was there an exploration of the fullness of the possibilities raised by information alleged. These information pieces suggest that attention should be given to these claims until the full truth is revealed and actions taken based upon that full truth. Some but all of the information pieces are included in this report.
2. The Significance of RBI
writes on September 27, 2016: "On Sunday, September 25, 2016, Bell Island turned a corner. For the first time in many years, people rallied to have their say about how one of the biggest assets in this community will be governed. That asset is Radio Bell Island. Bell Island's first and only radio station has become a life line for those who are shut in, a source of information for the people, a place to request a song, an avenue to make a donation for a good cause. Radio Bell Island has seen families gather around the kitchen table for the first time, in possibly a long time, just to play the game of Bingo. RBI has brought Bell Island to the person whom lives away from but longs to be home. we hum the jingles from the commercials, we cannot wait to hear

vital programming to our Radio station. For the first time we can hear council meetings, attend church, a local minor hockey game and other events without even leaving our couch through the magic of RBI and the internal work of it's volunteers. Imagine our own little island has its own Radio station! This did not happen without vision, many volunteer hours and great expertise from a lot of people."

- 4.) There is another picture of the young actors in costume presenting to the Boys and Girls Club Bell Island. Again sharing the history of the founders of Bell Island.
- 5.) ********has written plays on the Mining History of Bell Island. A number of pictures show scenes from his play, "Life of a Miner". Apparently very professionally done.
- 6.) There is picture of a poster entitled "Theatre of the Mine". This impressive poster shows the theatre at the 1916 mine site (apparently restored) and pictures of the actors in costume and this poster declares the "Theatre of the Mine" to be "A Project of the Tourism Bell Island Inc." and supported by the Town of Bell Island and the province of NL.
- 7.) The ghosts of Bell Island. Three of the ghost stories which he shares on his RBI show about the Ghost of Bell Island".
- 8.) The military heritage of Bell Island is also celebrated. Two guns have been restored overlooking the Ferry Dock. The Mediator was presented with before and after pictures.
- 9.) Harry's Look Out is featured as a project. The site celebrates one of Bell Island's most popular musicians, Harry Thomas Hibbs.
- 10.) The Ghost stories of Bell Island are recreated and retold by Not only through his radio shows on RBI, on his walking tour of the places where ghost still haunt but also through his play, "The Ghost of Bell Island". The efforts to recall the ghosts of Bell Island have resulted in a 25 cent coin / postage stamp as part of the Haunted Canada series of September 2016. The Bell Island "Hag" from the Dobbin's garden is seen bearing down on a farmer on this stamp / coin. The story of "the Dobbin's Garden Hag" has been featured in the Downhome Magazine.
- 11.)In an article written by Chris Lackner entitled Bell Island "Canada's X-Files Island", is quoted: "The most recent mystery to beset the island occurred on April 2, 1978. On that otherwise calm day, a loud explosion caused damage to homes and electrical wiring, and created two perfectly square craters in the ground."
- Teachers and a program run at the Town of Wabana Hall. Among the other projects of are: "The Party at Nan's" which includes opportunities to display the skills of the young Bell Island actors; The Valentine Celebrations with all three of Adult, Teenage and Kiddies Dances; March Hockey Day; the Greenhouse & some agricultural land Bell Island has the second richest agricultural land in the province and plans to put it to use; Work has commenced on a "Slip Way".

(b.) The Business of Managing Money from Government or other Grants or from funds raised by

One of the disturbing aspects of this mediation was the allegation that money was not being used

according to the rules. This discovery was almost accidental and was not pursued with any effort by this mediator. This allegation is most concerning and should be further investigated. The full extent of the management of monies from grants and other sources is only hinted at by the following:
Incident #1:
Incident #2: In the same summer of 2015, www. was paid \$250 for a "gig" for which he never played questioned the \$250 and was told: "Spend the money or give it back."
Incident #3: August 14, 2016: The band with four musicians, contracted for a performance fee of \$800.00.
(Comment: I have performed hundreds of fee for service duties, rarely would I be given a "tip" and when I was given a little extra, it was \$25 or \$50 not \$400.)
Incident #4: security, volunteered for Bell Fest 2016 and the Summer Concert. Mr. was a total of \$150 because had to get rid of excess grant money".

Incident #6: There was an event at the Bell Island Senior's Complex where for the 3 rd time, and provided an afternoon of music and treats for the senior citizens. Was asked to provide a receipt for \$200 for XXX at end of the afternoon. Was was surprised because on the two previous years there was no request for a receipt.

(This seems reasonable if the receipt reflected the actual value of the donated services. The concern is what the receipt used for. To show that \$200 was donated by XXX . This could be used to offset some of the other gifts to entertainers or other uses of RBI money.)



There was no written agreement. The agreement had been acted upon for a number of months before in the absence of any notice to the school, the agreement was changed and the three sharing parties were reduced to two. SMRHS was eliminated from the sharing of the BINGO proceeds despite the previous agreement. There was no negotiation between the three parties as to this change. There was simply a resolution at a RBI board meeting that the process was changed.

This mediator notes that change in the Bingo proceeds sharing is despite RBI broadcasts from SMRHS. RBI had since its inception had free accommodation with no charge for utilities at SMRHS. Some of the furniture used by RBI was that of the SMRHS, at least at the early stages of operation. The school or those connected to the school were involved at an intimate level in the setting up, management, development and the operation of RBI. The RBI was a learning tool that was used for instructional purposes at the school for some time. The use of RBI for educational purposes appears to be less so most recently. Some SMRHS students were exposed to the inner workings of a radio station. As the RBI BINGO developed, the students became engaged in assisting to prepare cards for the Radio Bingo.

Caccepted responsibility for distribution of the cards to stores and other locations and to collect unsold cards and money from the sales locations. This worked very well as the results of the BINGO showed.

SMRHS Students Stamping each BINGO Card

SMRHS had an additional contribution to the BINGO process. The students would weekly stamp on each "mill news print paper card" purchased from British Confectionary from a single stamp the following: "Radio Bell Bingo" on the upper most line or the heading; on a second line was an acknowledgement of the three way BINGO proceeds partnership: "SMRH', "RBI", "RBI". The third line described in larger print the date of the particular BINGO. The fourth line indicated the PO Box of RBI. The 5th line had the address of that post office box. The 6th line had a phone number to call to make contact in the event of possession of a winning card or to contact RBI for any reason. This stamp was used to print on all BINGO cards well past the RBI resolution ending an automatic share for SMRHS.

The money that came from BINGO was used according to the purposes. This included one of the most expensive undertaking of the school year, the Graduation Celebration and Activities surrounding the school grad. The students stamped all the BINGO cards. The ongoing stamping of the BINGO Cards became an issue when according to the students from the High School were replaced with grade VII students. The privately recruited graduating students to come to an outside the school location to stamp the bingo cards. The students would either be paid directly for doing so or the money earned for this task would be held and presented later to offset some expenses related to graduation. SMRHS reports that they have never received any money from RBI or TBI to assist in offsetting the graduation expenses.

The Involvement of SMRHS in the RBI and the expulsion of the SMRHS Principal from the Board

Number 2 Mine comes under the control of the Bell Island Historical Society. The Historical Society conduct a tour of the "Mining Museum" and the # 2 Mine. About 13,000 visitors annually take this tour.

The Number 4 Mine has a Collar (an area at the entrance to the mine) which is used. The actual mine itself begins about one hundred feet from the entrance to the Collar. At this point, access to # 4 Mine was prevented by a steel wall.

This steel wall was erected by the Department of Natural Resources at that about 100 foot mark to prevent access to this mine. Indeed, this steel wall prevented access to the mine. The Collar of the mine was apparently deemed safe and was used as a theatre showing local plays written, and I believe produced and directed by

The collar was apparently deemed safe because the steel wall was erected some distance from the entrance of the mine. wrote in August of 2016: "Natural Resources (NR) has not done any maintenance on the structure in question and we cannot comment on the structure's stability nor the appropriateness of planned use of the (Collar)." Using the structure should do so with the understanding that the structure is not being maintained and NR cannot comment on the structure's stability." Further writes that: "There may be physical hazards and/ or chemical hazards present of which NR is not aware."

Appendix: A

Robert T. Smith Steps undertaken to appreciate the conflict and gathering enough facts to conduct a mediation:

I, Robert T. Smith, as a retired Provincial Judge with completed training at Level I, II mediation and some experience with mediation both professionally and as a volunteer was approached to see if I would be willing to undertake mediation with the parties involved in RBI. As a retired Judge, I emphasized to the Chief Administrative Office that I was not acting as a Judge but as a mediator with past experience in the area of mediation. Indeed, I informed that I should not be referred to as Judge. I had retired and was no longer serving as such.

Although the commonality of University training is a clear characteristic of 21st Century way of life, I shared with the Town Council that I possessed a BA from St. Mary's University, a BEd from Memorial University and a LLB from Dalhousie. In addition, I had an extra year of courses from MUN. I also had been certified in Reality Therapy having trained over three years and been examined in Hollywood Florida in 1986. I had published an article on its use in corrections in Newfoundland and Labrador.

I was asked to Mediate as a volunteer but that not acceptable as I am aware of the amount of effort that conducting a complex mediation could take. I requested \$50.00 per hour and that included travel time. I was aware of my pension income and I point to the B. Wicks Judges Tribunal Report of May 11, 2015 at paragraph 144 where the daily rate for Full Time Provincial Judges is stated at that time to be \$937 and for Part Time Judges was \$870. I was in service as a Part Time Judge in 2015. I had retired on the last day of 2008, but continued in Part Time service until June 2016. My request was an hourly rate was less than one half of the 2015 Part Judges hourly rate of \$117. That request was acceptable to the Town. It was agreed that I would submit my bill at the time I submitted my report to council.

I agreed and outlined what I believed to be the process that should be followed: Stage #1: Agreement from the parties as to their participation in the Mediation. This stage was a statement of willingness to discuss but is not a commitment to agree to settle. Without this agreement from the parties to participate in the mediation there is no purpose to attempt mediation.

I informed the Town of Wabana through its Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) of that first requirement. To emphasize, I repeat that the authority to conduct mediation comes from the consent of those engaged in dispute. Without that consent there is no point in attempting a sharing or the next step in the mediation process which is a negotiation between the parties.

Most of my experiences in mediation occurred in Provincial Court in the civil suit process known as a "Settlement Conference". This is a legislated mandated stage prior to trial. The stage one Mediation process is absent in the Settlement Conference. In other words there is a required mediation. Many parties were reluctant. I presided over hundreds of these with most disputes resolved. Sometimes there is anger and resentment but in discussing what was at stake, the parties would calm down and participate. The resolution was rarely to either party's complete satisfaction. A resolution means energy, time, resources; money that would go into a trial with an uncertain outcome now could be redirected elsewhere.

When contacted by the Chief Administrative Officer of the Town of Wabana, my first emphasis was there must be an agreement to mediate. I was not aware of previous failed attempts. Failed prior attempts are not an indication that another mediation attempt might not succeed. Sometimes a failed mediation might mean the experience of participation might mean a gain of insight that sets the stage for a successful attempt. I found the participants to be articulate, very bright, very focused, showing an understanding the details of the dispute in remarkable detail. After many hours of meetings, it was my feeling that one side was looking for a vindication of actions already taken and the other side was looking for compromise and a return to an earlier stage of RBI presence in SMRHS.

Stage #2: Gathering the facts and giving the opportunity to each party individually and privately to conceptualize their positions and to vent privately without having to measure each word. Much effort was given to seeking out the circumstances of the persons involved and understanding the facts of the dispute. This stage was completed with care. Stage #3: At this stage, there is communications between the parties in dispute. Each party states their position and discussion takes place.

Stage #4: Negotiation. This stage means that both parties have an opportunity to advocate their desired goal in settlement. The mediator suggests a middle ground in trying to reach a settlement. The Mediator's suggestion may be altered and debated and other options proposed.

Stage #5: Closure. The settlement agreement is placed in writing and both parties sign the agreement of settlement.

In the early stages of stage #3, one party exited because had other commitments informed the clerk that would not participate further. It is my feeling that this departure was predictable and there was not any sincere effort to acknowledge any acceptance of the mediation process.

I should indicate that Linda Hickey, Chief Administrator Officer for the Town of Wabana, was the executive officer as indicated for negotiating a contract for the services of this mediator. Linda Hickey was responsible for setting up a meeting place, contacting and arranging the attendance of participants, sorting out the schedules, often doing the introductions. As a qualified "Partnership Broker" (PB), Linda Hickey often had to use of her skills as a PB to encourage reluctant relevant persons to co-operate and participate in the mediation process. Linda Hickey used her training as a PB to encourage interest based negotiation as an opportunity to advance the circumstances of participants. Often this skill became apparent during the introductions. Linda Hickey was helpful in the post mortems in identify the changing issues.

"Funds raised through lotteries must be used for a charitable or religious object or purpose. This means that the proceeds must be used for the relief of poverty, advancement of education, the advancement of religion, or other purposes beneficial to the community. Specifically we have use of proceeds rules for College and University Groups (80 KB) and K-12 Schools (88 KB).

The following are a list of unapproved use of proceeds:

- upkeep or maintenance of service clubs;
- · to promote tourism or other activities that are economic in nature;
- · municipal infrastructure or development;
- for lobbying purposes or to oppose changes in law or government policy;
- education purposes of members of groups other than k-12 and college and university groups;
- expenses of political parties;
- professional development for nurses, teachers and other professionals;
- · membership conferences for service clubs;
- membership fees for organizations, their members or staff in professional or recreation associations;
- · pay salaries of support staff;
- operational expenses of groups.


