If this is the usual way of transporting medevac patients to the airport, then I feel reassured. Please make sure that 23. (1) has a properly fitted N95 mask during transportation.

The second issue of concern is whether this patient will go to the airport when the plane arrives. If ^{23. (1)} is likely to refuse to get on the Medevac plane at the last minute this will be a wasted resource. I know this is a difficult situation and there are no guarantees 23. 1 , but how certain are you that ^{23. (1)} is willing to get on a medevac plane?
