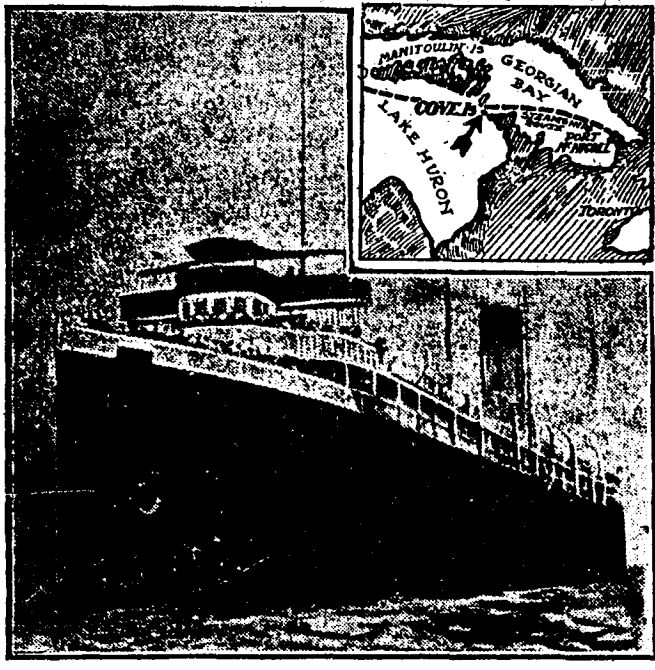

OFFICIAL RETURNS MAKE NO CHANGES

The official election figures handed in yesterday do not change the standing of the parties. In North Wentworth the Conservative majority is larger than was formerly given out, and Dr. McQueen, the Liberal candidate, will not demand a recount.

Stratford, July 2.—Sheriff Magwood, Returning Officer for North Perth, to-day gave the official summary up of the election in North Perth. Mr. Torrance's majority is 1,117 over Mr. Robertson and 722 over the combined vote of the Liberal and Socialist candidates.

Woodstock, July 2.—The declaration of the poll in South Oxford election, made this afternoon, gives a clear, Conservative, a majority of four over Col. T. R. Mayberry. It is not known as yet whether there will be a recount or not.

Chatham, July 2.—(Special.)—George W. Sulman had a majority of eighteen over R. L. Bracklin, his Liberal opponent at the recent election, in West Kent, according to the official count announced to-day by Sheriff Gemmill, Returning Officer for the riding. The total vote cast was 8,022, of which Mr. Sulman received 4,022.

Chesley, July 2.—The official declaration gives William McDonald, Liberal, a majority of six in North Bruce. Mr. A. H. VanDusen, Conservative candidate, will probably demand a recount. It was reported that McDonald's majority was 12.
