ROYAL COMMISSION MIGHT DIVIDE FOR A TIME

SUGGESTION TO OVERCOME DIFFICULTY OF DELAY THROUGH FOG.

SOLDIERS KILL FOUR IN RIOT AT DUBLIN

Then they had a running fight with the volunteers and the rapidly growing mob through the streets to their barracks.

A number of policemen have been suspended for refusing to try to disarm the volunteers. After the troops had fired into the crowd, the angry populace in a spirit of revenge attacked individual soldiers and beat them brutally. Members of the Scottish Borderers, who were riding bicycles along the quays, were pulled from their machines and beaten, and the bicycles were thrown into the river.

Chief Magistrate's Protest. The Lord Mayor has issued a strong protest, in which he declares that the troops were ordered out without permission having been asked of the Lord Mayor of the city, and he demands that the responsibility shall be fixed for the calling out of the soldiers and for supplying them with ball cartridges. He adds:—

"Dublin and Ireland look with confidence to John Redmond and his colleagues to bring to justice those responsible for this shocking outrage. There must no longer be one law for a section of the Ulster people and another law for the remainder of the Irish people."

Volunteers Parade Ulster. To-day's tragedy caused a great sensation. The Nationalists are indignant over the affair, because, they say, the troops are against the Nationalist volunteers and never interfere with the Orangemen. Five thousand Ulster volunteers, carrying arms, paraded the Belfast streets to-day under the eyes of General Macready and other officers of the regular army, and passed the Dorset Regiment, which was on parade.

Oddfellow Drops Dead at Decoration Service

PORT ARTHUR, July 26.—Alderman R. G. Spofford fell dead this afternoon in the act of decorating graves at the Oddfellows' memorial service at the cemetery. Mr. Spofford was a pioneer member of the Oddfellows. He was a native of Owen Sound, and leaves a wife and two children.

SERVIA'S REPLY TO AUSTRIAN ULTIMATUM

of Serbia's reply, the way to a peaceful settlement ought to stand open. The correspondent at St. Petersburg of The Times says:— "Russian diplomacy has noted today certain indications of unwillingness on the part of all the powers, including Austria, to go to war if it can possibly be avoided."

Attorney-General's Opinion. The Right Hon. Sir John A. Simon, Attorney-General, referring to a speech at Manchester last night to the European situation, said:— "It should be resolved that any part that Great Britain plays shall, from the beginning to the end, be the part of mediator, and not of promoter, of a better and more peaceful relations."

Austria's Determination. London, July 26.—Sunday's developments appear to furnish new proofs that Austria is fully determined to make war on Serbia, and the possibility of a general European war seem greater than ever confronted the present generation.

The Serbian reply to the Austro-Hungarian ultimatum was an acceptance of almost all the imperious demands, except that Austrian officials shall not participate in the investigation and fix the responsibility for the anti-Austrian propaganda. Serbia presented an appeal to the powers at the Hague for the settlement of that feature.

Serbian Minister Gets Passports. Notwithstanding this humiliating surrender, which was more than Europe expected of the proud little nation, the Austrian Government today gave the Serbian Minister his passports, which may be construed as a virtual declaration of war.

May Launch Sudden Blow. Even now the Austrian armies may be closing in upon Serbia and launching a sudden blow, as Japan did when she sent her fleet against the Russian ships without warning.

While Austria announces a "partial" withdrawal of her troops, the British Admiralty issued orders to-night keeping the British fleet on a war footing.

Russian Army to Mobilize. St. Petersburg, July 25.—The mobilization of the Russian army will proceed immediately. The Emperor has fully approved the decision of his Ministers to this effect.

bank rate from four to five per cent., and the Committee of the Bourse has decided to close the Bourse on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The committee explains that its decision was dictated by regard for the public interests, to prevent an unwarranted disturbance of industrial interests and to counteract disquieting reports.

Snows of War. The Nieuw Freie Presse says that the Minister of Finance will raise \$65,000,000 for the Government's immediate requirements, and adds that negotiations between the powers for the localization of the conflict will continue. In diplomatic circles there is a feeling of optimism that these negotiations will be successful, and it was said by one of the diplomats today that "France has no intention to expose herself too much on Serbia's behalf."

Baron Giesl Von Gieslingen, the Austro-Hungarian Minister to Serbia, who left Belgrade last night on the breaking off of diplomatic relations, arrived here to-day.

The Imperial decree issued yesterday gives the Government enormous powers to insure the secrecy of its measures. The authorities are entitled to open all letters. Only telegrams approved by the censor can be despatched to any point. Newspapers publishing details of military preparations or movements can be suppressed. All the railways are guarded by sentries, who are under orders to use their arms on any person approaching the line who fails to stop when commanded.

Serbia is Patriotic. The prospect of war is not regarded here as a child's play. The Serbians put 400,000 men into the field during the Balkan wars. Both officers and men are passionately patriotic. It is expected that Serbia will attempt to hold the front along the Danube and the Drina with only a weak force, while the greater part of the army will be concentrated in the central district, probably near Nish or Kragujevatz, and another strong force in Novipazar, which will be destined for offensive operations against Bosnia.

Kaiser Cancels Holiday. Christiania, Norway, July 26.—(Special.)—The Kaiser, who spent the week at his favorite resort on the Norwegian coast, Balholmen, in Bogenfjord, left on board the yacht Hozenoller direct for Kiel at 6 o'clock on Saturday evening. His departure was very sudden. He had arranged to stay in Norway another week. A high officer in the Kaiser's suite left on board the speediest destroyer in the fleet, which had orders to go direct to Kiel.
