COMPLAINT for VIOLATION of

The undersigned complainant being duly sworn states:

That on or about June 16, 1980, at Miami, Florida, Dade County, in the Southern District of Florida

(1) Ian Jackson Mac Donald

did(2) knowingly and wilfully escape from a representative of the Attorney General, to wit: the United States Marshal for the Southern District of Florida, who was then and there holding the defendant pending extradition proceedings and pursuant to legal process duly issued by the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida, all in violation of Title 18, United States Code, §751(a).

And the complainant states that this complaint is based on the following facts: On 6/15/80, Ian Jackson Mac Donald was in the custody of federal authorities at the Federal Correctional Institute, Miami, Florida pending completion of extradition proceedings in the U. S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida when he began complaining of angina pains. Following this, he was taken to Coral Reef General Hospital for examination. On or about 6/16/80 Ian Jackson Mac Donald escaped from the custody of the U. S. Marshal while undergoing treatment for angina pains at Coral Reef General Hospital.

And the complainant further states that he believes that Inspector Jim Simmons, U.S. Marshal Service

are material witnesses in relation to this charge.
